But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. ¹³Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. 14Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.



ADULTS AND OLDER CHILDREN

The candidates who are able to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Sponsors, as follows

Sponsor I present ______ to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Bishop asks each candidate when presented

Do you desire to be baptized?

Candidate I do.

INFANTS AND YOUNGER CHILDREN

Then the candidates unable to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Parents and Godparents, as follows Parents & Godparents

I present _____ to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When all have been presented the Bishop asks the parents and godparents

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life? Parents & Godparents

I will, with God's help.

Bishop Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ? Parents & Godparents

I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Question Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?


